## PHAD ART by KALYAN JOSHI


Phad painting or Phad is a religious style of scroll painting and folk painting practiced in Rajasthan. This style of painting is traditionally done on a long piece of cloth or canvas, known as phad. The narratives of the folk deities of Rajasthan, mostly of Pabuji and Devnarayan are depicted on the phads. The Bhopas, the priest-singers traditionally carry the painted phads along with them and used these as the mobile temples of the folk deities. The phads of Pabuji are normally about 15 feet (4.6 m) in length, while the phads of Devnarayan are normally about 30 feet long. Traditionally the phads are painted with vegetable colours. Born in 1969, Kalyan Joshi comes from a lineage of Phad painters that dates back to the 14th century. In addition to continuing in the traditional style of Phad painting, Kalyan experiments with contemporary style painting and line drawing.



















## MATA NI PACHEDI by SANJAY CHITARA


Mata ni pachedi literally means "behind the mother goddess", and is a cloth that constitutes a temple of the goddess. When people of the nomadic Vaghari community of Gujarat were barred from entering temples, they made their own shrines with depictions of the mother goddess on cloth. The paintings usually have a set pattern, with the mother goddess dominating the central area in her mighty form, surrounded by deities and commoners worshipping her with equal reverence. In Ahmedabad, artisans make these paintings using the same methods followed 200 years ago. Cotton fabric is first de-starched and then treated with harda paste (black myrobalan) to prepare it for absorbing the colour.

Outlines of the figures are painted first, with black colour prepared from jaggery and iron. After this, red colour, extracted from tamarind seeds, is filled in and the areas supposed to be white are left blank. The strong lines and bold use of colour, that reflect the power and energy of the goddess, have now transformed to more artistic and detailed illustrations, however the depiction style of mythical characters remains the same.

He won the Gujarat State Award In 1999 and a National Award in 2000.






## BENGAL KALIGHAT PAINTING by ANWAR CHITRAKAR

The tradition of patua painting is associated with West Bengal, where there are small colonies of patuas or village artists, who paint on long vertical paintings illustrating stories in a series of descending panels. In these scrolls the deeds of Krishna, adventures of Rama or other popular subjects are depicted scene after scene as the scrolls are gradually unwound. Such scrolls are not intended for sale but rather to equip the artist for a second important function – that of a wandering singer. Covering a radius of 10-15 miles from his village, the patua goes from village to village gathering an audience around him, displaying his scrolls and intoning their contents. At the end of the 19th century, the British set up institutions that imparted a European style of academic training to Indian artists. The Calcutta School of Art was one such school and attracted traditional artists-the patuas-to the city. Initially these artists were concentrated around the temple at Kalighat where there was a demand for religious art. Gradually, they started to learn from the newer techniques and discovered that these could help them increase their earnings. The Kalighat School is a unique blend of two different styles of painting the Oriental and the Occidental.

Anwar has won the West Bengal State Award in 2002, the National Award in 2006 and President's Award amongst others. His paintings are part of the collection at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, the Mumbai International Airport and are also held in private collections.




















Born in 1979 at Mysore, J S Sridhar Rao, whose father was a carpenter, has been fascinated with colours. He began to paint as a child using whatever he could find lying around at the house of a scholar and connoisseur of art, where his father was employed. Recognizing his latent ability, he was taken to K V Seetharaman, a master of Mysore style. Sridhar quickly learnt the skills and nuances of the art, from his mentor to become an accomplished artist. He works diligently to make his own paper and colours using natural herbs and dyes. This endows his work with a freshness and luster. He has also specialized in restoring old and damaged paintings. One of Sridhar's masterpieces is a composition depicting the Vijayadasami procession of Krishnaraja Wodeyar III that he was inspired to create on coming across some scrolls in the collection at V&A Museum in London. Some of his work adorns important personal and corporate collections in India and other countries. A resident of Mysore, Sridhar works at the Traditional Art Gallery at Jaganmohan Palace in the city.
